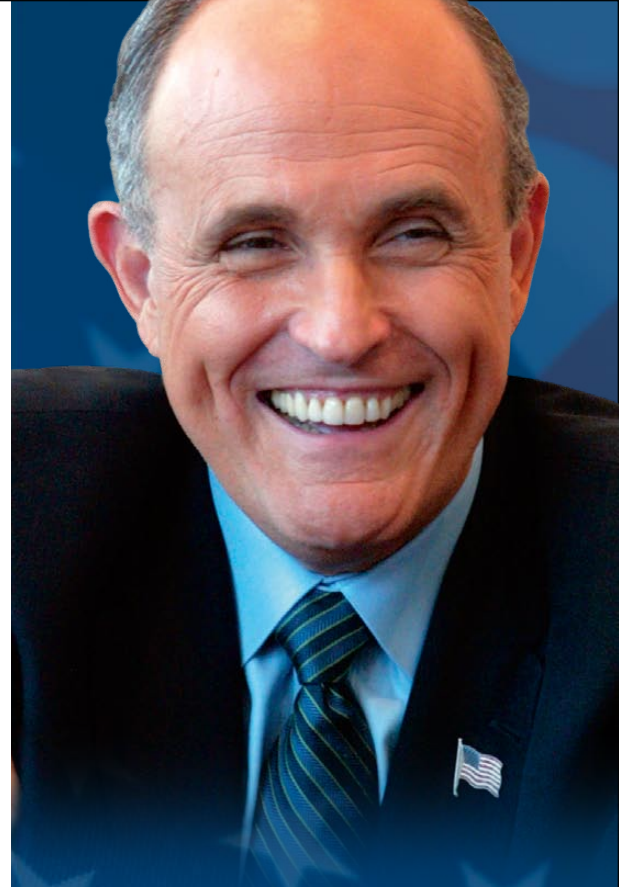

**Rudy Giuliani will cut taxes.**

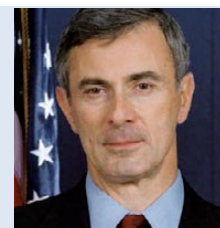
- Permanently end the death tax.
